Mission Statement

Mercy Multiplied exists to provide opportunities and resources for all to experience God's unconditional love, forgiveness, and life-transforming power.

What We Do

Mercy has a Residential Program for women ages 13–32 and Outpatient Programs for men (Louisiana only) and women aged 13 or older. These services are voluntary, biblically-based, and free-of-charge. Through our Outreach Services we provide multiple resources online and onsite designed to equip men and women of all ages to live free and stay free in Jesus Christ.

2022 Accomplishments

1. Our residential homes continue to provide essential services to our residents. Mercy's Intake Department fielded 12,750 contacts (phone calls, emails, texts) and processed more than 868 applications.
2. In response to the reversal of Roe v Wade, we increased our efforts to reach more women facing an unplanned pregnancy. A letter was sent to approximately 3,000 crisis pregnancy centers sharing about our services. We received calls from centers in Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Missouri, New York, Tennessee, Texas, Pennsylvania, Washington, and Wisconsin adding us to their referral list.
3. In September, we celebrated the two-year anniversary of the Mercy Center for Wellness and Counseling in West Monroe, LA. The demand for our services is so great in this area that we are hiring another counselor. To date we have helped 179 people in this community. Men and women aged 13 and older receive free outpatient counseling at this location. What's even more exciting is we just launched our second Center for Wellness and Counseling in St. Louis, MO. Women ages 13 and older can receive free counseling services at this center.
4. Our Outreach Services team had the opportunity to reach over 1,000 pastors, including Spanish speaking pastors, at various forums this year. Many were excited to hear about *Keys to Freedom* and taking the study back to their churches.

2023 Goals

1. Expand the reach of our non-residential counseling through the Mercy Multiplied Center for Wellness and Counseling by opening additional locations.
2. Increase Outreach Services through varied offerings of MPower and Church Support Services.
3. Launch a short-term free-of-charge *Keys to Freedom Retreat* for adults 18 and older (initially women only) in our St. Louis location.

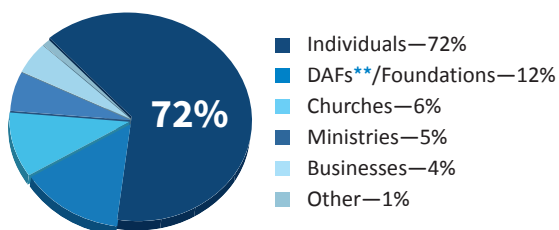

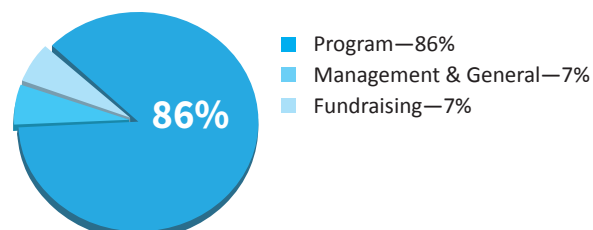
